# WORKSHOPS

## **BOUNDLESS PAGES: A JOURNEY OF FREEWRITING:**

Give yourself time and space to free your thoughts. Join us on a journey of self-exploration and creativity, where we inspire you to generate original writing using creative prompts and readings. Get your thoughts out and down on the page, create a story to share with others, or escape into your own imaginative world. There is freedom in freewriting! Deepen your creative sensibilities while also connecting with what really matters to you.

**BROWN BAGGIN' IT WITH PORKCHOP:** Brown bags are not just for lunch, "Brown Baggin' It" is a workshop hosted by Porkchop where students can create their own brown bag puppets out of paper, cardboard, markers and glue. Come ready to make your favorite "character" out of a simple brown paper bag.

## **CHARCOAL DRAWING: HOW TEXTURE AFFECTS FORM:**

This charcoal drawing workshop will teach participants to identify and replicate observed textures on simple forms such as a cube or sphere. Other organic, free-flowing forms, such as fabric, will also be observed and discussed.

**CIRCUS ART (DROP-IN):** Circus Balancing Acts and Juggling with the Trenton Circus Squad. The squad will offer balancing and juggling interactive workshops for all participants. Globe walking, stilts, tightwire, ball, ring and club juggling, and diabolos will all be offered.

**CONTEMPORARY DANCE WORKSHOP:** This workshop is designed to find freedom in movement while emphasizing technique and artistry. This workshop will include a warm-up, across the floor movement, and a contemporary combo. Students of all levels are encouraged to participate!

**CREATIVE EXPRESSIONS: THIS IS ME!:** This workshop will focus on visual arts, creating alternate self-portraits made up of found objects, various papers and fabrics, collage materials, etc. The larger idea is that sometimes we can express our true selves, who we are inside and out, in a more out-of-the-box way because, let's be real—who wants to be in the box? A landscape face? Colors only? Words and images? Yes, limitless!

**EMPTY BOWLS CERAMIC WORKSHOP:** This workshop engages students in a social awareness project while they hand build pottery bowls. The empty bowl is a powerful symbol to remind us of hunger and those among us in need. The donated bowls will be sold at various events with the money going to help those with food insecurities. Empty Bowls partners with the Soul Kitchen, Holiday Express, 180 Turning Lives Around, and their upcoming event will be held at Lunch Break, Red Bank, NJ, this spring.

**FIGURE DRAWING:** Practice drawing the human form with a live model using vine charcoal and newsprint paper. The model will do a series of short poses. Learn about gesture drawing, proportions, negative space, volume, and shading.

**FROM VISION TO VIDEO: A CRASH COURSE IN FILMMAKING FOR BEGINNER USING YOUR SMARTPHONE:** Learn the art of smartphone filmmaking in our intensive 45-minute workshop, where you'll learn to shoot and edit a one-minute film using just your phone. Gain insights into narrative construction, visual framing, and editing on the go to create engaging, high-quality content. Leave the workshop with theoretical knowledge and a completed one-minute film showcasing your new skill set.

**JEWELRY MAKING HAS NO LIMITS:** Wrap, rivet, melt, engrave, stamp, enamel, etch, anodize, oxidize, patina, and the list goes on. The only limit is your imagination, and that has no limits!

**MAKING AWARD-WINNING CHARACTERS WITH KONKRET COMICS:**

Learn how to make award-winning comic book characters with Derek "Lonzo Starr" Allen, publisher of the award winning Konkret Comics by breaking down the steps it takes to make your very own comic book character. ## **MUSICAL THEATRE ENSEMBLE BUILDING & APPRECIATION:**

This masterclass discusses the importance of the ensemble in a musical production and how they add to the telling of the story. Students will work together as an ensemble to bring a song/story to life. The class will also feature a few ensemble-building exercises.

**RADICAL EXPRESSIONISM WITH DOODLE DUDE:** Art Kaney (The Doodle Dude) will teach radical expressionism with your art cartooning, illustration and animation.

**SCENE STUDY FOR ALL ACTORS:** Scene Study is open to advanced and beginning actors. Scripts will be provided for 2 or 3-person scenes. Students will explore objectives, connections with other actors, and the final product. So much fun and open to all!

## **SHORT PODCAST CREATION & RECORDING BOOTCAMP**

**WITH RADIO STATION 90.5 THE NIGHT:** Grab a partner or come solo to brainstorm a simple podcast with pre-written prompts. Then, record your segment and we'll help you produce it! This quick experience will give a peek into the nuts and bolts of podcast creation.

**THEATRE DANCE & AUDITION TECHNIQUES:** These theatre dance workshops cover a range of shows from "Guys and Dolls" to "A Chorus Line" to "Bye Bye Birdie" and "Chicago", etc. The workshop consists of a full warm-up, isolations of the body parts most emphasized in the choreographer's style, and the time period from the show. It includes the audition technique of what a real New York audition consists of. Show choreography will be given, broken down, and then performed.

**THE WONDERFUL WORLD OF FOUND ART:** Come and get creative with trash in this fun and experimental workshop. Participants are encouraged to think outside the box and make their own one-of-a-kind works of art from everyday objects headed for the landfill.

## **WEARABLE SCULPTURE DESIGN: HEADPIECES &**

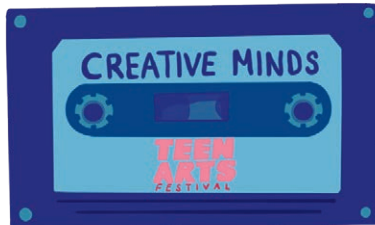

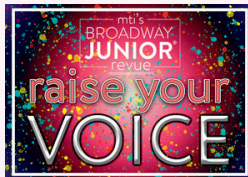

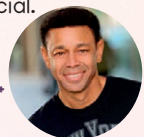
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
